ALL RESIDENTS EAST of FIFTH STREET will need a RESIDENTS' PARKING PER-MIT!!! East of Fifth Street will be closed to all traffic on Delaware City Day, July 16, 2016. If you did not get a parking permit previously, you are asked to stop by Town Hall at 407 Clinton Street to obtain a Free Parking Permit if you plan on moving your car that day. You will need to show your registration card for all vehicles in your household and a parking permit will be issued for all vehicles for free. Without a permit you will not be able to enter the City until after the fireworks. If you still have your parking permit placard from last year it is still good and you will not need to reapply.

# From Diary of DC Resident Mary Jarrell Dated May 20, 1897 Submitted By: Ann Blackmore

20<sup>th</sup> I hired a horse and carriage and drove down to James this morning after Alex. He came up from Cheswold yesterday. Stopped in Middletown to spend the day. But found Mrs. Burris gone to Wilmington. She is very miserable. Then when Jimmy went from here he went to Middletown for Alex. Alex suffered all day with his stump leg. We headed home about half past five. I took a pair of shad and two qts of strawberries down with me. The Episcopals held a festival last night and tonight. Our entertainment we had in the hall last week cleared \$37.00 The Foreign Missionary Society packed a box to go to Japan for next Christmas last Tuesday night in the chappel. I saw it was the first I ever saw. I packed. There are a good many things useful went in the box.

Delaware City held their municipal elections on Thursday, May 5, 2016. Congratulations to the newly elected Council Members Paul (Bud) Fitzwater, III; Natalie Greene; and Megan Titus. They will serve for two years. They were sworn in on Monday, May 16, 2016. Thanks to Paul Johnson and Beth Konkus for their service as Council Members.

The Special Election on whether to annex Fort DuPont into Delaware City was also held on May 5, 2016. The Annexation passed with a vote of 286 For and 150 Against. At the May 16, 2016 Mayor & Council Meeting at 6:30PM, Ordinance 16-0516-01 relating to the annexation of Fort DuPont will be introduced and given its first reading. There will then be a public hearing on 6-20-16 at 6:00 PM on said ordinance with a second reading and possible adoption of the ordinance which will complete the annexation of Fort DuPont into the City of Delaware City. Both Mayor & Council meetings will be held at the Paul H. Morrill, Jr. Community Center, 250 Fifth Street.
