NOTICE

YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR A REDUCTION ON YOUR CITY PROPERTY TAX AND WATER RATES

With certain household income limitations, you may be eligible for a reduction on your city property tax and water rates during fiscal year 2020. (Beginning July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2020)

The household income, excluding Social Security and disability pension, is limited to:

Single Applicant:

\$20,000

Married Applicants:

\$25,000 (combined income)

Household:

\$25,000 (total household income)

You may be eligible if you were 65 years of age or a disabled resident on SSI and have owned your current residence for one (1) year, by December 31, 2018, and your income does not exceed the limits above.

- 1. You must submit the following documents with your application: Copy of Federal Tax Form (1040) for 2018. If you do not file a Federal Tax Form, you must submit: a copy of 2018 Social Security Benefit Statements, a copy of 2018 interest statements, and a copy of 2018 pension statements if applicable.
- 2. Proof of income for all household residents over 18 years old
- 3. Certificate of Insurance Award if disabled
- 4. Proof of age and address (Matching items 1-3 above) shall be presented. These include Picture ID, License, or Birth Certificate for homeowner applying for discount.

Applications for Exemptions are available at Town Hall. If you need assistance filling out the application please feel free to stop by Town Hall, and we will be glad to assist you. Office hours are Monday through Thursday from 8:30AM to 5:30PM and Friday from 8:30AM to 12:30PM.

PLEASE NOTE: This application form <u>and</u> the required documents must be submitted <u>every</u> <u>year</u> to demonstrate continued eligibility.

ELECTION INFORMATION

QUALIFICATIONS FOR MAYOR AND COUNCILPERSON

Any qualified voter of the City of Delaware City

- 1. Who is a qualified voter at least eighteen (18) years of age.
- 2. The "qualified voter" as used herein shall mean a person who is a registered voter with State of Delaware at the time that his/her nominating petition is filed.
- 3. Who is a United States Citizen.
- 4. Who has not been convicted of a felony as that crime is designated by the State of Delaware.
- 5. Who has established one (1) year residency in the City at the time their nominating petition is filed by furnishing identification and proof of residency.



Every person:

- 1. Who maintains their permanent place of residence within the City limits of Delaware City.
- 2. Who has reached the age of eighteen (18) years.
- 3. Who is a citizen of the United States.
- 4. Who is registered to vote under the State of Delaware's voter registration system maintained by the Department of Elections 30 days prior to the date of the Election.
- 5. Who can prove the foregoing information by proper identification.

You can register to vote at <u>Ivote.de.gov</u> and follow the instructions to register to vote.

If you do not have a computer, you can come to Town Hall, 407 Clinton Street, during normal business hours (Monday through Friday 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.) and we will help you register.

CODE RED NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

The City of Delaware City has implemented an Emergency Notification System, Code Red. It is designed to notify our residents of various types of emergencies such as: bad weather; Flooding; natural disasters and emergency information from the police and fire departments.



Signing up for this system is not mandatory, but we would strongly urge your participation so we can notify you and your family of any emergency situation.

SIDEWALK CODE

In accordance with City Code, Section 8-6 all residents (owners and tenants) are responsible for maintaining the sidewalks, immediately abutting their property in a safe and clean condition, free of litter, debris, excessive vegetation and in good order and repair.

SIDEWALK SNOW REMOVAL

All sidewalks must be cleared of snow/ice within 24-hours of the end of the snowfall. Snow is not permitted to be deposited in the street gutters. A \$25.00 fine will be issued to any property in violation of this ordinance - City Code Chapter 8, Sections 10 - 12



FLOOD HAZARD AREAS

Delaware City is vulnerable to coastal storms and flooding. A significant percentage of the town is located within the FEMA defined 1% chance flood plain. These areas are noted as Zone AE on the FEMA flood map and are particularly susceptible to flooding. To find out if your property is in the Special Flood Hazard Area and the base flood elevation of your property or to find more information for flood protection please call Town Hall at 302-834-4573.

A few ways to protect your property from a flood hazard is to elevate your furnace above the base flood and to store your valuables and insurance papers upstairs in a waterproof container. You can also visit our website www.delawarecity.delaware.gov and click on Floodplain Management on the left side of the screen for more information.

Flash-flooding is the general type of flooding caused by the Canal and Dragon Run. For Delaware City, flooding will occur if there is a storm surge or if two or more high tides take place without an intervening ebb tide. **Turn around, don't drown!** It is very hard to judge just how deep flood waters can be. Designate a place where your family can meet if an evacuation order is issued.

Contact your insurance agent to see if you have flood insurance. Remember flood insurance only covers the structure. It does not cover your home's contents. Make sure you get the additional insurance for your contents. If you are a renter, you can get a Preferred Risk Flood insurance policy for your contents. Do not forget flood insurance does not go into effect for 30 days. Call your insurance agent today.

If you have to repair your home after a storm, or at any time and your property is in the floodplain, please contact Town Hall at 302-834-4573 to get a permit and find out ways to build back stronger. Most repairs will need a permit. You can visit our website www.delaware.gov for more information.

SAFETY REMINDERS

Please make sure house/business numbers are visible from the street so first responders are able to see them. House numbers should be at least 4-inches high and business numbers should be at least 6-inches high.

If you are using an alternative heating device (i.e. space heaters, etc.) be careful of where they are placed. DO NOT place near anything that can catch fire (i.e. blankets, curtains, etc.). If using a propane heater, please be sure the propane is stored properly.




DELAWARE CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT
