Crime Information:

General Information

- Reminder to parents – Parent's must accompany their minor child (age 12 and under) when they are at the playground.
- No child under the age 12 years of age and under are not permitted to be left home alone without supervision.
- Motorists are reminded to use caution when driving through the city. There has been an increase in bicyclist and pedestrian traffic in the city.
- **Section 26-22 Curfew for Minors Under Eighteen** – Generally It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of eighteen (18) years to loiter, idle, wander, stroll or play in or remain unnecessarily upon the public streets, highways, roads, alleys, parks, playgrounds, wharves, docks or other public grounds, public places and public buildings, places of amusement and entertainment, vacant lots or other unsupervised places, whether by foot or in a motor vehicle or other conveyance between the hours of 10:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M., of the following day, official city time; provided, however, that the provisions of this Section shall not apply to a minor accompanied by his parent, guardian or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor, or where the minor is upon an emergency errand or legitimate employment directed by his parent, guardian or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor.
