## **Crime Information:**

Sunday, 2/3/2019 – DCPD investigated a terroristic threatening that allegedly occurred in front of a residence in the 100 block of Clinton Street. According to the victim, a 72 year old Delaware City resident, a man in a white Chevrolet Cruz pulled up next to him as he was seated in his pick-up truck and threatened to kill him. DCPD was able to apprehend the suspect a 56 year old New Castle resident in front of the Delaware City Fire Hall. After investigating the incident, the victim decided that he did not want prosecution and the suspect was later released.

Friday, 2/15/2019 – Sometime between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, February 13<sup>th</sup>, someone removed a package from the front porch at a residence in the 100 block of Jefferson Street.

On Saturday, March 16, 2019, the Delaware City Police Department arrested Danette M. Hurtt, 40, of Middletown, DE and charged her with providing a false statement to a law enforcement officer in effort to delay/hinder a police investigation. The charges stem from an incident that occurred last week (Saturday, March 10<sup>th</sup>) in which Ms. Hurtt reported to police that she had been kidnapped when she climbed into her vehicle after leaving Crabby Dick's restaurant shortly after 6:00 p.m. Ms. Hurtt had reported that three men were hiding in her vehicle. They blind folded her and drove her to the rear of the Appoquinimink High School parking lot where she was later released. An investigation involving the Delaware City police with the assistance of the New Castle County Police and the Middletown Police Departments led to the determination that the incident never occurred and was fabricated by Ms. Hurtt.
