#### **Crime Information:**

Sunday, 10/14/2018 – Theft Report - Sometime between 1100 p.m. Saturday, October 13<sup>th</sup> and 3:30 p.m. Sunday, October 14<sup>th</sup>, someone removed various items of lawn equipment from the bed of a pick-up truck belonging to the victim who resides in the 300 block of Nowland Drive.

Friday, 10/19/2018 – The DCPD responded to an assault in progress complaint in the Delaware City Mobile Home Park. Over investigation revealed that an altercation occurred between Edward D. Beck, 54 and Molly G. Kendall, 32. Both were charged with assault in the third degree.

Sunday, 10/21/2018 — The DCPD responded to the 900 block of Solomon Place for an overdose. Our investigation revealed that a 37 year old male allegedly overdosed on illegal drugs in the residence. Our investigation also revealed the individual was not a resident of Delaware City. The individual was transported to the Christiana Hospital by a Delaware City Fire Company Ambulance for treatment.

Wednesday, 10/24/2018 – Criminal Mischief – Sometime between 7:00 p.m. Wednesday, October 24th and 3:00 p.m. Thursday, October 25th, someone appears to have keyed the driver's side door and passenger side door of the victim's vehicle. This incident took place in the 100 block of Clinton Street.

Monday, 10/29/2018 – Trespassing – The DCPD responded to a residence in the 900 block of Solomon Place in reference to a possible trespassing in progress complaint. A check of the residence revealed no one was inside at the time. However, our investigation revealed that a Michael G. Krieg, 37 of Claymont, Delaware was living in the residence without the owner's consent or knowledge.

Tuesday, 10/30/2018, Trespassing – The DCPD responded to a residence in the 900 block of Solomon Place in reference to a possible trespassing in progress. Upon our arrival, officers were able to apprehend two individuals hiding on the third floor of the residence. Charged with trespassing were Chad E. Herman, 36 of the unit block of Noble Ct, Newark, DE and Connie M. Stewart, 32, of the 200 block of S. Boxwood Road, New Castle, DE. Warrants were also obtained for Michael Krieg, 37 of the 3000 block of W. Court Avenue, Claymont, DE. He was later apprehended by the Middletown Police Department and turned over to DCPD.

#### **Grants**

On Wednesday, November 14, 2018, The Delaware City Police Department was awarded \$ 3,537.43 from a SALLE grant (State Aid To Local Law Enforcement). The funds will be used for overtime for investigative related matters, community policing, public education programs, and to pay for the state police chief's conference. The Delaware City Police Department was also awarded \$3,210.00 from an EDIE grant (Emergency Illegal Drug Activity). The funds will be used to purchase CCTV camera equipment. The camera equipment will be installed in strategic areas of the city to detect and deter illegal drug activity. In addition, this is part of our strategic plan to place CCTV's throughout the city.
